The **“Fairy Reel”** is a traditional tune popular in Scotland and Ireland and was Caroline’s competition at the Mid Atlantic Fleadh Cheoil (Irish Music Competition), where she took first place for the second year in a row. She will be heading to Ireland in August to attend the music school (Scoil Éigse) and compete in the All-Ireland music competition.

“Ronde de Loudéac/ The Wren”- is a set of traditional Breton tunes from Maggie Sansone’s “Celtic Fair”,

“Watchmakers” (traditional Irish reel) we learned from Maggie Sansone’s “Celtic Fair”.

“High Road to Linton” (traditional Scottish reel).

“Gaitas del Infernu” (*Bagpipes from Hell*) by Javier Tejedor of the Asturian group Tejedor from their CD “Llunáticos.”
